Advertisers are welcome to post multiple ads, providing additional payment and gift cards are submitted.

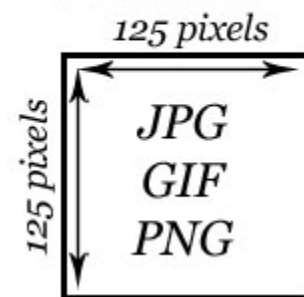
Advertising Appearance
